Mvemba Phezo Dizolele is a senior fellow and director of the Africa Program at the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS). He is also a lecturer in African studies at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies.

Prior to CSIS, he was the Africa senior adviser at the International Republican Institute and served as the course coordinator for central and southern Africa at the U.S. Foreign Service Institute. He has served as an international election monitor and delegate in several countries, including Nigeria, Ethiopia, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Mr. Dizolele’s analyses have been published in the *Journal of Democracy*, *New York Times*, *Newsweek International*, and many other outlets.

Mr. Dizolele holds an international MBA and an MPP from the University of Chicago. He is a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve and is the author of the forthcoming biography, *Mobutu: The Rise and Fall of the Leopard King* (Random House).
