Vincent Spera is currently Deputy Assistant Secretary for East Africa and for Regional/Multilateral Affairs U.S. Department of State's Bureau of African Affairs. From 2021-24, he served as the U.S. Consul General in Johannesburg, South Africa. His other overseas assignments include serving as Acting Deputy Chief of Mission and Political/Economic Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, and earlier as a political, economic, and consular officer in Mongolia, Canada, and Chad. In Washington, he has served as the Director of the Office of African Affairs in the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor; as Acting Director of the Africa Bureau's Office of East

African Affairs; and as Crisis Management Coordinator in the Department's Operations Center. Before entering the Foreign Service, he worked in the U.S. non-profit and private sectors, focusing on education and workforce development policy. Mr. Spera holds a Master's of Public Policy from Georgetown University in Washington, DC, and a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from Stockton University in Pomona, New Jersey. His wife, Marissa Maurer, is a retired U.S. Foreign Service Officer, and they have two daughters. He speaks Swahili and French.
