

Rachel K. Alpert is a Partner at Jenner & Block LLP, where she co-chairs the firm's National Security, Sanctions, and Export Controls Practice and the Human Rights and Global Strategy Practice. She counsels domestic and international clients on a range of issues, including export controls and sanctions compliance, business and human rights, supply chain accountability, and national security reviews by the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS). Rachel previously served for seven years as an Attorney-Adviser in the US Department of State's Office of the Legal Adviser, serving under two presidents and four secretaries of state. In this role, she advised on legal issues affecting US relations with Cuba, Venezuela, Mexico, Central America, and the Caribbean.
