

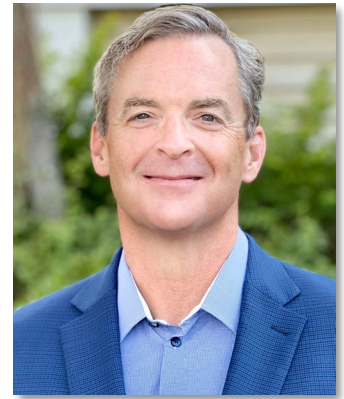

### **Operations Officer, 5<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (Airborne) S-3 / Deputy J3, Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force-Iraq (CJSOTF-I), Balad, Iraq (July 2009 -July 2010), Major**

- Served as the Chief Operations Officer for 5<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (Airborne) focused on the Middle East and the Horn of Africa, coordinating all regional Special Forces deployments and activities.
- Responsible for the employment, coordination, and synchronization of all Special Forces and Navy SEALs elements in Iraq as the US reduced its forces transitioning from Operation Iraqi Freedom to Operation New Dawn. Worked closely with international, interagency and Iraqi partners.

### **Operations Officer, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 5<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (A) S-3 / Special Operations Task Force-Central S-3, Baghdad, Iraq (June 2008 – July 2009), Major**

- Lead planner for Operation YARBOROUGH, the largest Psychological Operation in Iraq to retake the border city of Amarah (Maysan province) back from the Shia Militias (Apr-May 2008).
