

Ilan Berman is Vice President of the American Foreign Policy Council in Washington, DC. An expert on regional security in the Middle East, Central Asia, and the Russian Federation, he has consulted for both the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency and the U.S. Department of Defense, and provided assistance on foreign policy and national security issues to a range of governmental agencies and congressional offices.

A prolific author, Mr. Berman's writings have appeared in *Foreign Affairs*, the *Wall Street Journal*, *USA Today* and the *Financial Times*, among many other publications. He is a member of the Associated Faculty at Missouri State University's Department of Defense and Strategic Studies. He also serves as a columnist for *Forbes.com* and the *Washington Times*, and as the Editor of *The Journal of International Security Affairs*.

Mr. Berman is the editor of two books - *Dismantling Tyranny: Transitioning Beyond Totalitarian Regimes* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2005), co-edited with J. Michael Waller, and *Taking on Tehran: Strategies for Confronting the Islamic Republic* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2007) - and the author of three others: *Tehran Rising: Iran's Challenge to the United States* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2005), *Winning the Long War: Retaking the Offensive Against Radical Islam* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2009) and *Implosion: The End of Russia and What It Means for America* (Regnery Publishing, 2013). His new book, entitled *Iran's Deadly Ambition: The Islamic Republic's Quest for Global Influence*, will be published by Encounter Books in the Summer of 2015.
