



Simon Henderson is the Baker Fellow and director of the Gulf and Energy Policy Program at the Washington Institute for Near East Policy. Born and brought up in Britain, he has lived in the U.S. since 2006 and is now a U.S. citizen. His published works include a biography of Saddam Hussein (*Instant Empire: Saddam Hussein's Ambition for Iraq*. Mercury House, San Francisco, 1991) and two studies of the Saudi royal family, both published by the Washington Institute – *After King Fahd: Succession in Saudi Arabia* (1994), and *After King Abdullah: Succession in Saudi Arabia* (2009). Originally a journalist, he reported for the BBC from Pakistan in 1977-8 and for the Financial Times from Iran during the Islamic revolution in 1978-9 and the U.S. embassy hostage crisis in 1979-80.
