

Dr. Tricia Bacon is an Assistant Professor at American University's School of Public Affairs. She earned her PhD in International Relations at Georgetown University in 2013. Prior to her employment at American University, Dr. Bacon worked on counterterrorism for over ten years at the Department of State, including in the Bureau of Intelligence and Research, the Bureau of Counterterrorism, and the Bureau of Diplomatic Security. She specialized in research and analysis on terrorist groups and counterterrorism issues in South Asia. She was also a Pre-Doctoral Fellow at the Brookings Institution, a Visiting Scholar and Terrorism Research Award recipient at the National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism (START) at the University of Maryland, a PRISP Fellow, and Presidential Management Fellow at the State Department. Her research focuses on terrorist and insurgent groups' decision-making and alliance behavior, the impact of foreign fighters on conflicts, U.S. counterterrorism policy, and militancy in South Asia.
