Thomas J. Baker is an international law enforcement consultant. He served for over 33 years as a FBI Special Agent in a variety of leadership positions dealing with terrorist and criminal challenges. He has extensive experience with police management and training issues, having served as a management instructor at the FBI academy in Quantico, Virginia. He has been published in professional journals, both nationally and internationally, on aspects of biometrics, major case management, and police training. He has presented before national and international forums, concerning these topics as well.

His writing has also appeared in the *Wall Street Journal*, *The Hill* newspaper, the *Washington Examiner*, and the *Daily Caller*. On television, he has provided commentary on the Fox News channel, Fox Business, and MSNBC, as well as being featured in segments of CNN's *Crimes of the Century* and NBC's *Date Line*.
