During my five minutes of questions, the following exchange occurred with you:

- Q: ... I looked on Lexis. I couldn't find any case in which you've served as counsel of record in which you finally prevailed. Can you name one?
- A: I've worked on legal teams that have prevailed at every level of the federal judiciary, including the Supreme Court of the United States.
- Q: Can you name a case?
- A: Yeah, sure. So Tyson v. Bouaphakeo which is a case at the Supreme Court.

If your answer continues to include *Bouaphakeo*, please provide a specific citation to the court decision or filing reflecting your having served as counsel of record.
