For more than 30 years, John H. Wilson participated in all phases of the litigation process, from being counsel for both the plaintiff and defense in personal injury matters, to the prosecution and defense of criminal matters, to being the court itself.

Judge Wilson served as an Assistant District Attorney in Bronx County, New York. He was a trial attorney for the in-house counsel for a major insurance carrier, and has also managed both a private practice and a boutique law firm, handling both plaintiff's personal injury and criminal defense matters. He was elected to the Civil Court, Bronx County in 2004, and served as a Judge in the Criminal Courts of New York City for ten years.
