Michael G. Carroll was appointed Deputy Inspector General at the U.S. Agency for International Development, Office of Inspector General (USAID/OIG) effective February 6, 2006. Mr. Carroll is a member of the Senior Executive Service with more than 30 years of government service.

Prior to this appointment, Mr. Carroll served as the Director of Administration for the Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) in the Department of Commerce. BIS works to advance U.S. national security, foreign policy, and economic interests. As the Director of Administration, he was responsible for managing BIS resources, including personnel, budget, and financial management, as well as policy and administrative matters. Before joining BIS, Mr. Carroll served as the Assistant Inspector General for Management at USAID, the Deputy Executive Director of the U.S. Nuclear Waste Technical Review Board, and in several management positions at the U.S. Information Agency.

Born in New York City, Mr. Carroll spent a great deal of his youth in Turkey, Guam, the Philippines, and Cuba. He holds a bachelor's degree in transportation management from St. John's University, New York, and is a graduate of the Federal Executive Institute and of George Washington University's Executive Development Program.
