

Doug Shulman most recently served as the Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service. Before his tenure at the IRS, Shulman was Vice Chairman of the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA) and its predecessor, the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD), where he had previously served as Executive Vice President and later as President of Markets, Services and Information. Earlier in his career, Shulman, among other jobs, had positions in private equity and with an entrepreneurial start-up. He also served as Senior Policy Advisor and later Chief of Staff of the National Commission on Restructuring the IRS, and was involved in the start-up phase of Teach for America. Shulman started his career at the consulting firm AT Kearney.

Shulman holds a BA from Williams College, an MPA from Harvard University John F. Kennedy School of Government, and a JD from Georgetown University Law Center.
