

Biography of Deputy Assistant Inspector General for Investigations Allan Williams



Allan Williams is the Deputy Assistant Inspector General for Investigations, Office of Inspector General (OIG) of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). He oversees investigations for the OIG's Office of Investigations (OI), specifically for field offices located in the Midwestern and Western regions of the United States, including Hawaii and Guam. These investigations include allegations of contract fraud, grant fraud, employee misconduct and threats directed against EPA personnel and facilities, as well as other violations of federal law within the purview of the OIG's jurisdiction.

Mr. Williams recently assumed oversight responsibility for the OIG's Office of Professional Responsibility, where he served as the Special Agent in Charge prior to his current post. In his earlier role, Mr. Williams supervised highly sensitive investigations of both political appointees and Senior Executive Service employees.

Mr. Williams began his government career with the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) Office of Inspector General as an Evaluator in the Audit Directorate. Later, he worked at the USPS OIG Washington Field Office as a Special Agent, successfully conducting an array of investigations with a specialty in financial investigations. As a lead financial investigator, he received numerous awards including the Assistant Inspector General Award for Investigations, and served details as acting Assistant Special Agent in Charge.

Mr. Williams has a bachelor of science degree in business administration. He is a member of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners and a former member of the National Technical Investigators Association.
