 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.

1 SEC. 2. NATIONWIDE MAIL DELIVERY SCHEDULE.

- 2 Section 404 of title 39, United States Code, is3 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 4 "(f)(1) The Postal Service may establish a general,

5 nationwide mail delivery schedule of 5 days per week.

- 6 "(2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to au-
- 7 thorize a reduction, or to require an increase, in frequency
- 8 of mail delivery for any address for which the Postal Serv-
- 9 ice provided delivery on fewer than 6 days per week as
- 10 of January 1, 2013.".

18 "Postal Service revenues and expenses under this19 chapter shall be funded through the Postal Service Fund.

7	tacle is situated at the edge of a sidewalk abutting
8	a road or curb, at a road, or at a curb; and

11	"(b) Policy.—It shall be the policy of the Postal
12	Service to use the most cost-effective primary mode of
13	mail delivery feasible for postal patrons.
14	"(c) Phaseout of Door Delivery.—
15	"(1) BUSINESS ADDRESS CONVERSION.—The
16	Postal Service shall implement a program to convert
17	existing business addresses with door delivery to
18	curbside or centralized delivery to the maximum ex-
19	tent feasible.
20	"(2) Residential address conversion.—
21	"(A) IDENTIFICATION.—Within 1 year
22	after the date of enactment of this section, each
23	district office shall identify residential addresses
24	within its service area that are appropriate can-
25	didates for conversion to curbside or centralized

1	delivery, in accordance with standards estab-
2	lished by the Postal Service.
3	"(B) CONVERSION ORDER.—The Postal
4	Service shall seek to voluntarily convert the de-
5	livery points identified under subparagraph (A)
6	from door delivery to more cost-effective pri-
7	mary modes of mail delivery.

9	versions under subparagraph (B), the Postal
10	Service shall establish procedures—

10 normal-cost percentage for employees of the United States
11 Postal Service and make such adjustments as the Office
12 considers necessary—

"(i) upon request of the United States Postal
Service, but not more frequently than once each fiscal year; and

(b)(1)(B), and consistent with paragraph (5), for fiscal
year 2013, and each fiscal year thereafter, the Office—
"(A) shall use demographic factors specific to
current and former employees of the United States
Postal Service, unless such data cannot be generated; and

"(B) may use economic assumptions regarding
 wage and salary growth that reflect the specific past,
 and likely future, pay for current employees of the
 United States Postal Service.".

5 SEC. 8. ONE-TIME FEDERAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYS6 TEM PROJECTED PENSION SURPLUS RE7 FUND.

8 (a) CALCULATION.—Not later than September 1, 9 2014, the Director of the Office of Personnel Management 10 shall compute the amount of the supplemental liability under paragraph (1)(B) of section 8423(b) of title 5, 11 12 United States Code, with respect to current or former em-13 ployees of the United States Postal Service and the Postal Regulatory Commission and their survivors as of Sep-14 15 tember 30, 2013, using the assumptions established by the amendments made by section 7 of this Act. 16

17 (b) REFUND.—If the Director of the Office of Personnel Management determines under subsection (a) that 18 the Postal Service has a negative supplemental liability as 19 of September 30, 2013, the Director shall transfer an 20 21 amount equal to one-half of such negative supplemental 22 liability from the Civil Service Retirement and Disability 23 Fund established under section 8348 of title 5, United 24 States Code, to the Postal Service on—

(1) September 30, 2014; and

(2) September 30, 2015.
 SEC. 9. TREATMENT OF MOST RECENT EXIGENT RATE IN CREASE.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-5 sion of law, rule, or regulation, until revised by or in ac-6 cordance with law, the rates and classes for market-domi-7 nant products which are in effect as of January 26, 2014, 8 shall, for all purposes (including further revision under 9 subchapter I of chapter 36 of title 39, United States Code) be treated as the rates and classes for market-dominant 10 products. 11

(b) MARKET-DOMINANT PRODUCT DEFINED.—For
purposes of this section, the term "market-dominant product" has the meaning given such term under section 102
of title 39, United States Code.
