The Honorable Patrick P. O'Carroll serves as FLEOA's Executive Director and chief staff executive. He is an advocate and advisor on governmental, congressional, and media relations. FLEOA is the largest nonpartisan, nonprofit professional association, exclusively representing federal enforcement officers. FLEOA represents more than 26,000 federal law enforcement officers from over 65 different agencies.

Mr. O'Carroll is a Fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA) which is an independent, non-profit, and non-partisan organization established to assist government leaders in building more effective, efficient, accountable, and transparent organizations. The Academy's unique feature is its 800+ Fellows which includes former cabinet officers, Members of Congress, governors, mayors, and state legislators, as well as prominent scholars, business executives, and public administrators.

Mr. O'Carroll served as the third Inspector General for the Social Security Administration (SSA), having been presidentially appointed to that position and confirmed by the Senate on November 24, 2004. Under his direction, the SSA Office of the Inspector General (OIG) inspired public confidence in the integrity and security of SSA's programs by conducting independent and objective audits, evaluations, and investigations.

Mr. O'Carroll directed an OIG workforce of 600 auditors, attorneys, investigators, and support personnel nationwide. The results of their efforts can be seen in the OIG's most recent achievements. In Fiscal Year 2015, the OIG's investigators reported over \$700 million in investigative accomplishments through SSA recoveries, restitution, fines, settlements, judgments, and projected savings. In addition, the OIG's auditors issued 89 reports with recommendations identifying more than \$3 billion in federal funds that could be put to better use, and over \$4 billion in questioned costs. And the OIG's attorneys reported over \$17 million in civil monetary penalties and assessments. In an April 2015 report, The Center for Effective Public Management at Brookings focused on the most quantifiable metric of OIG performance, the return on investment (ROI), and found the SSA OIG to consistently have the highest ROI in the IG community.

Mr. O'Carroll was a member of the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE), and served on the CIGIE Audit and Legislation Committees providing leadership to the Federal IG audit community; and making recommendations to congressional committees and GAO. Most recently, Mr. O'Carroll acted as principal liaison between CIGIE and the White House implementing an Executive Order and legislation on reducing federal improper payments. He was Co-Chair on the Investigations Committee and a member of the prestigious Integrity Committee which was composed of principals from the Office of Special Counsel, DOJ Public

Integrity, Office of Government Ethics, and the FBI. The purpose of the Integrity Committee is to review, assess, investigate, and determine the validity of allegations of wrongdoing lodged against Inspectors General.

Mr. O'Carroll also brought to the OIG the benefits of more than 24 years of experience with the United States Secret Service. He worked in the Newark, New Jersey and New York City field offices as both an agent and supervisor. Mr. O'Carroll served protective assignments for Presidents Carter, Reagan, Bush, and Clinton. As the Assistant Special Agent-in-Charge of the Counterterrorism Section, he coordinated Secret Service participation in the first World Trade Center bombing investigation, the attempted assassination of former President George H.W. Bush by Saddam Hussein, and an assassination plot against President Hosni Mubarak of Egypt. As an Inspector, Mr. O'Carroll also supervised investigations involving an airplane crash and shootings at the White House, and coordinated the Secret Service's participation in the Oklahoma City bombing investigation and prosecution.

Mr. O'Carroll received a Bachelor of Science from Mount Saint Mary's College in Emmitsburg, Maryland, and a Master of Forensic Sciences from the George Washington University in Washington, D.C. He also attended the National Cryptologic School and the Kennedy School at Harvard University. Mr. O'Carroll is a member of the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the Association of Government Accountants, and the National Academy of Public Administration. He has Top Secret & SCI security clearances.
