AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 4182

OFFERED BY MR. CONNOLLY OF VIRGINIA

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1SECTION 1. STUDY ON LENGTH OF PROBATIONARY PE-2RIOD.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the 4 United States shall conduct a study on Federal agencies 5 that have lengthened the employee probationary period 6 from 1 to 2 years and other potential extensions of proba-7 tionary periods for certain occupations in the Federal Gov-8 ernment.

9 (b) CONTENTS.—The study required under sub-10 section (a) shall analyze—

(1) (1) any impact of an existing 2-year probationary period (compared to a 1-year probationary period) on the employing agency's ability to deal with underperforming employees, improve productivity, improve recruitment and retention, and accomplish the mission of the agency and shall include the Department of Defense as a case study; and $\mathbf{2}$

(2) whether certain occupations in the Federal
 Government should have probationary periods in ex cess of 1 year because of the complexity, sensitivity,
 or unique occupational challenges of such occupa tions, including—

6 (A) whether such a probationary period ex-7 tension would provide supervisors sufficient 8 time to adequately assess employee performance 9 and whether the extension would lead to 10 measureable improvements in the performance 11 of employees in those occupations; and

(B) an identification of the occupations,
and the characteristics of those occupations,
that would benefit from longer probationary periods, including requirements to exercise supervisory authority and possess professional licenses and training.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 2 years after the date
of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall
submit to the Committee on Oversight and Government
Reform of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
of the Senate a report containing the study required under
subsection (a).

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to provide for a study on the length of probationary periods for certain Federal employees, and for other purposes.".
