3	(b) EVIDENCE OF LAWFUL STATUS.—Section
4	202(c)(2)(B) of the REAL ID Act of 2005 (49 U.S.C.
5	30301 note; Public Law 109–13) is amended—
6	(1) in clause (viii), by striking "or" at the end;
7	(2) in clause (ix), by striking the period at the
8	end and inserting "; or"; and
9	(3) by adding at the end the following:
10	"(x) is a citizen of the Republic of the
11	Marshall Islands, the Federated States of
12	Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau who
13	has been admitted to the United States as
14	a nonimmigrant pursuant to a Compact of
15	Free Association between the United
16	States and the Republic or Federated
17	States.".
