Re: Hearing on "Constitutional Checks and Balances: Improving Congressional

Oversight of the Executive Branch"

On <u>Tuesday, March 10, 2020, at 10:00 a.m., in room 2154 of the Rayburn House</u> <u>Office Building</u>, the Committee will hold a hearing on the Constitutional basis of Congressional oversight and potential reforms to increase the accountability of the Executive Branch.

#### I. SCOPE AND PURPOSE OF HEARING

Article I of the Constitution vests Congress with the authority to legislate and appropriate funds. Congress has the responsibility to investigate in order to exercise these and other authorities effectively and efficiently. The Trump Administration's unprecedented stonewalling in multiple investigations prevents Congress from fulfilling its Constitutional oversight function. This hearing will explore reforms to restore the Constitutional balance and safeguard Congressional power to hold the Executive Branch accountable.
