Questions from Congresswoman Cori Bush

1. **Question**: Among those who assume unpaid care work responsibilities, how many are women?

Answer: The American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) and the National Alliance for Caregiving (NAC) published a report titled, *Caregiving in the U.S. 2020*. This report is based on nationally representative quantitative online surveys with 1,392 caregivers ages 18 and older. According to the 2020 AARP and NAC report, 61 percent - or three in five - of the nation's 53 million caregivers are women.¹

2. **Question**: Among those who assume unpaid care work responsibilities, what proportion are women of color?

Answer: According to the 2020 AARP and NAC report, 17 percent of caregivers are Hispanic or Latino, 14 percent are African-American or Black, 5 percent are Asian American and Pacific Islander, and 3 percent report being some other race/ethnicity, including multiracial.²
