AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R.

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
2	This Act may be cited as the "Artificial Intelligence
3	Training for the Acquisition Workforce Act" or the "AI
4	Training Act".
5	SEC. 2. ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TRAINING PROGRAMS.
6	(a) Definitions.—In this section:
7	(1) AI.—The term "AI" has the meaning given
8	the term "artificial intelligence" in section 238(g) of
9	the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization
10	Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (10 U.S.C. 2358 note).
11	(2) AI TRAINING PROGRAM.—The term "AI
12	training program" means the training program es-
13	tablished under subsection $(b)(1)$.
14	(3) COVERED WORKFORCE.—The term "covered
15	workforce" means—
16	(A) employees of an executive agency who
17	are responsible for—

1	(i) program management;
2	(ii) the planning, research, develop-
3	ment, engineering, testing, and evaluation
4	of systems, including quality control and
5	assurance;
6	(iii) procurement and contracting;
7	(iv) logistics; or
8	(v) cost estimating; and
9	(B) other personnel of an executive agency
10	designated by the head of the executive agency
11	to participate in the AI training program.
12	(4) Director.—The term "Director" means
13	the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-
14	et.
15	(5) Executive agency.—The term "executive
16	agency"—
17	(A) has the meaning given the term in sec-
18	tion 133 of title 41, United States Code; and
19	(B) does not include—
20	(i) the Department of Defense or a
21	component of the Department of Defense;
22	or
23	(ii) the National Nuclear Security Ad-
24	ministration or a component of the Na-
25	tional Nuclear Security Administration.

1	(b) Requirement.—
2	(1) In general.—Not later than 1 year after
3	the date of the enactment of this Act, and not less
4	frequently than annually thereafter, the Director, in
5	coordination with the Administrator of General Serv-
6	ices and any other person determined relevant by the
7	Director, shall develop and implement or otherwise
8	provide an AI training program for the covered
9	workforce.
10	(2) Purpose.—The purpose of the AI training
11	program shall be to ensure that the covered work-
12	force has knowledge of the capabilities and risks as-
13	sociated with AI.
14	(3) Topics.—The AI training program shall in-
15	clude information relating to—
16	(A) the science underlying AI, including
17	how AI works;
18	(B) introductory concepts relating to the
19	technological features of artificial intelligence
20	systems;
21	(C) the ways in which AI can benefit the
22	Federal Government;
23	(D) the risks posed by AI, including dis-
24	crimination and risks to privacy;

1	(E) ways to mitigate the risks described in
2	subparagraph (D), including efforts to create
3	and identify AI that is reliable, safe, and trust-
4	worthy; and
5	(F) future trends in AI, including trends
6	for homeland and national security and innova-
7	tion.
8	(4) UPDATES.—Not less frequently than once
9	every 2 years, the Director shall update the AI
10	training program to—
11	(A) incorporate new information relating
12	to AI; and
13	(B) ensure that the AI training program
14	continues to satisfy the requirements under
15	paragraph (3).
16	(5) FORMAT.—The Director is encouraged to
17	develop and implement or otherwise include under
18	the AI training program interactive learning with—
19	(A) technologists;
20	(B) scholars; and
21	(C) other experts from the private, public,
22	and nonprofit sectors.
23	(6) Metrics.—The Director shall ensure the
24	existence of a means by which to—

1	(A) understand and measure the participa-
2	tion of the covered workforce; and
3	(B) receive and consider feedback from
4	participants in the AI training program to im-
5	prove the AI training program.
5	(7) Sunset.—Effective 10 years after the date
7	of the enactment of this Act, this section shall have
8	no force or effect.
