**A BILL**

To require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to establish or otherwise provide an artificial intelligence training program for the acquisition workforce, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Artificial Intelligence  
5 Training for the Acquisition Workforce Act” or the “AI  
6 Training Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TRAINING PROGRAMS.**

2 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

3 (1) AI.—The term “AI” has the meaning given  
4 the term “artificial intelligence” in section 238(g) of  
5 the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization  
6 Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (10 U.S.C. 2358 note).

7 (2) AI TRAINING PROGRAM.—The term “AI  
8 training program” means the training program es-  
9 tablished under subsection (b)(1).

10 (3) COVERED WORKFORCE.—The term “covered  
11 workforce” means—

12 (A) employees of an executive agency who  
13 are responsible for—

14 (i) program management;

15 (ii) the planning, research, develop-  
16 ment, engineering, testing, and evaluation  
17 of systems, including quality control and  
18 assurance;

19 (iii) procurement and contracting;

20 (iv) logistics; or

21 (v) cost estimating; and

22 (B) other personnel of an executive agency  
23 designated by the head of the executive agency  
24 to participate in the AI training program.

1           (4) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means  
2           the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-  
3           et.

4           (5) EXECUTIVE AGENCY.—The term “executive  
5           agency”—

6                   (A) has the meaning given the term in sec-  
7                   tion 133 of title 41, United States Code; and

8                   (B) does not include—

9                           (i) the Department of Defense or a  
10                           component of the Department of Defense;  
11                           or

12                           (ii) the National Nuclear Security Ad-  
13                           ministration or a component of the Na-  
14                           tional Nuclear Security Administration.

15           (b) REQUIREMENT.—

16                   (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after  
17                   the date of enactment of this Act, and not less fre-  
18                   quently than annually thereafter, the Director, in co-  
19                   ordination with the Administrator of General Serv-  
20                   ices and any other person determined relevant by the  
21                   Director, shall develop and implement or otherwise  
22                   provide an AI training program for the covered  
23                   workforce.

24                   (2) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the AI training  
25                   program shall be to ensure that the covered work-

1 force has knowledge of the capabilities and risks as-  
2 sociated with AI.

3 (3) TOPICS.—The AI training program shall in-  
4 clude information relating to—

5 (A) the science underlying AI, including  
6 how AI works;

7 (B) introductory concepts relating to the  
8 technological features of artificial intelligence  
9 systems;

10 (C) the ways in which AI can benefit the  
11 Federal Government;

12 (D) the risks posed by AI, including dis-  
13 crimination and risks to privacy;

14 (E) ways to mitigate the risks described in  
15 subparagraph (D), including efforts to create  
16 and identify AI that is reliable, safe, and trust-  
17 worthy; and

18 (F) future trends in AI, including trends  
19 for homeland and national security and innova-  
20 tion.

21 (4) UPDATES.—Not less frequently than once  
22 every 2 years, the Director shall update the AI  
23 training program to—

24 (A) incorporate new information relating  
25 to AI; and

1 (B) ensure that the AI training program  
2 continues to satisfy the requirements under  
3 paragraph (3).

4 (5) FORMAT.—The Director is encouraged to  
5 develop and implement or otherwise include under  
6 the AI training program interactive learning with—

7 (A) technologists;

8 (B) scholars; and

9 (C) other experts from the private, public,  
10 and nonprofit sectors.

11 (6) METRICS.—The Director shall ensure the  
12 existence of a means by which to—

13 (A) understand and measure the participa-  
14 tion of the covered workforce; and

15 (B) receive and consider feedback from  
16 participants in the AI training program to im-  
17 prove the AI training program.

18 (7) SUNSET.—Effective 10 years after the date  
19 of enactment of this Act, this section shall have no  
20 force or effect.
