Diana R. Shaw serves as the Deputy Inspector General performing the duties of the Inspector General for the U.S. Department of State. She leads a global workforce whose mission is to detect and deter waste, fraud, abuse, and misconduct and to promote economy, efficiency, and effectiveness in the programs and operations of the Department of State, U.S. Agency for Global Media (USAGM), and the U.S. Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission.

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) provides oversight of more than 80,000 Department of State and USAGM employees, 280 overseas missions and other facilities worldwide, and more than \$81 billion in Department of State, USAGM, and foreign assistance resources. State OIG is also playing a critical role in conducting oversight of the U.S. response to Russia's war against Ukraine, as well as in the context of designated overseas contingency operations focused on Afghanistan, Iraq, and Syria.

Prior to performing the duties of the Inspector General, Ms. Shaw served as Deputy Inspector General for the Department of State. She has also held leadership positions within the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Office of Inspector General, most recently as the Assistant Inspector General for Special Reviews and Evaluations. Other previous positions include Assistant Inspector General for Legal Affairs, Acting Counsel to the Inspector General, and Director of the Special Reviews Group.

Before pursuing a career in government service, Ms. Shaw spent nearly a decade practicing law in the White Collar Defense and Corporate Investigations group at O'Melveny & Myers LLP, where she specialized in internal investigations and compliance counseling. Her clientele included heavily regulated Fortune 100 companies, investment banking firms, and financial institutions with operations spanning the globe. The bulk of her work focused on helping

clients identify and address fraud, waste, and abuse in their operations, and strengthen their compliance programs.

Ms. Shaw earned her undergraduate degree from Pepperdine University and her law degree from the University of Southern California. Before attending law school, she studied English Literature at Oxford University for 2 years and served as an advocate for special needs children. She is licensed to practice law in California and the District of Columbia.
