

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE  
TO H.R. 3358  
OFFERED BY MR. COMER OF KENTUCKY**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

**1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Mission not Emissions  
3 Act of 2023”.

**4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON FEDERAL CONTRACTOR DISCLO-  
5 SURE OF GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS AND  
6 CLIMATE-RELATED FINANCIAL RISK.**

7 (a) PROHIBITION.—Recipients of Federal contracts  
8 may not be required to do any of the following:

9 (1) Disclose greenhouse gas emissions and cli-  
10 mate-related financial risk as described in the pro-  
11 posed rule related to Federal Acquisition Regulation:  
12 Disclosure of Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Cli-  
13 mate-Related Financial Risk (87 Fed. Reg. 68312),  
14 or any substantially similar rule.

15 (2) Provide a greenhouse gas inventory or any  
16 other report on greenhouse gas emissions, including  
17 Scope 1 emissions, Scope 2 emissions, and Scope 3  
18 emissions.

1           (3) Develop and submit greenhouse gas emis-  
2           sions reduction targets for validation by any non-  
3           governmental organization, including the Science-  
4           Based Targets initiative.

5           (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

6           (1) GREENHOUSE GAS.—The term “greenhouse  
7           gas” means—

8                   (A) carbon dioxide;

9                   (B) methane;

10                  (C) nitrous oxide;

11                  (D) nitrogen trifluoride;

12                  (E) hydrofluorocarbons;

13                  (F) perfluorocarbons; or

14                  (G) sulfur hexafluoride.

15           (2) GREENHOUSE GAS INVENTORY.—The term  
16           “greenhouse gas inventory” means a quantified list  
17           of an entity’s annual greenhouse gas emissions.

18           (3) SCOPE 1 EMISSIONS.—The term “Scope 1  
19           emissions” means, with respect to an entity, direct  
20           greenhouse gas emissions that are emitted from  
21           sources that are owned or controlled by the entity.

22           (4) SCOPE 2 EMISSIONS.—The term “Scope 2  
23           emissions” means, with respect to an entity, indirect  
24           greenhouse gas emissions that are—

1 (A) associated with the generation of elec-  
2 tricity, heating and cooling, or steam, when  
3 such electricity, heating and cooling, or steam is  
4 purchased or acquired for the entity’s own con-  
5 sumption; and

6 (B) emitted from sources other than  
7 sources that are owned or controlled by the en-  
8 tity.

9 (5) SCOPE 3 EMISSIONS.—The term “Scope 3  
10 emissions” means, with respect to an entity, indirect  
11 greenhouse gas emissions, other than Scope 2 emis-  
12 sions, that are—

13 (A) a consequence of the operations of the  
14 entity; and

15 (B) emitted from sources other than  
16 sources that are owned or controlled by the en-  
17 tity.
