Broad Overview of Immigration Reform Bills

117th Congress Bills that Passed in the House:

In the 117th Congress, House Democrats used their majority to pass bipartisan immigration legislation that would have provided legal status for over 5 million immigrants:

- **H.R. 6, the American Dream and Promise Act**: Would provide a roadmap to citizenship for up to 4.4 million Dreamers, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) recipients, and Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) recipients. Passed the House 228-197 with 9 Republican votes. (118th Congress: HR 16.)
- **H.R. 1603, Farm Workforce Modernization Act**: Would provide a roadmap to citizenship for 1.5 million farmworkers and reform the H-2A visa program. Passed the House 247-174 with 30 Republican votes. (118th Congress: H.R. 4319)
- **H.R. 7946, the Veteran Service Recognition Act**: Would allow deported veterans a way to return to the United States and obtain lawful permanent residence status; prevent the deportation of veterans; and allow immigrant servicemembers to naturalize during basic training. Passed the House 220-208 with 3 Republican votes. (118th Congress: H.R. 4569.)
- **H.R. 1573, Access to Counsel Act**: Would ensure access to counsel for individuals with lawful status in the United States who are held in secondary inspection for over an hour. Passed the House 217-207. (118th Congress: H.R. 666.)
- **H.R. 1333, NO BAN Act**: Would restrict the President's authority to suspend or restrict individuals from entering the United States based on their religion or country of origin and prohibit religious discrimination in various immigration-related decisions. Passed the House 218-208 with 1 Republican vote.

- H.R. 16. American Dream and Promise. Rep. Garcia (D-TX) (109 Co-sponsors, 105 Ds, 4 Rs). Dream and TPS Holders legalization.
- H.R. 717. Repatriate Our Patriots Act. Rep. Vicente Gonzalez (D-TX) (21 Co-sponsors, 19 Ds, 2 Rs). Protects certain veterans of the Armed Forces from removal and expedites their naturalization.
- H.R. 1386. Equal Citizenship for Children Act of 2023. Rep. Yvette Clarke (D-NY) (24 Cosponsors, all Ds). Provides automatic citizenship for certain children born outside the United States.
- H.R. 1451. Fight for the American Dream Act. Rep. Ruben Gallego (D-AZ) (1 D Cosponsor). Allows DACA recipients to enlist in the armed forces and gain a pathway to permanent resident status.

- H.R. 1511. Renewing Immigration Provisions of the Immigration Act of 1929. Rep. Lofgren (D-CA) (75 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Expands eligibility to the registry program providing a pathway to lawful permanent resident status to undocumented individuals who have resided in the United States for at least 7 years.
- H.R. 1698. American Families United Act. Rep. Escobar (D TX) (41 Co-sponsors, 39 Ds and 2 Rs). Legislation to legalize spouses of U.S. citizens.
- H.R. 3043. Citizenship for Essential Workers Act. Rep. Castro (D-TX) (18 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Legalizes all essential workers.
- H.R. 3194. U.S. Citizenship Act. Rep. Sanchez (D-CA) (114 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Biden immigration bill including a path to citizenship for undocumented, expands legal pathways, addresses root causes etc.
- H.R. 3599. DIGNIDAD (Dignity) Act. Rep. Salazar (R-FL) (29 Co-sponsors, 21 Ds, 8 Rs). Bipartisan border security/legalization bill.
- H.R.3911 Ukrainian Adjustment Act of 2023. Rep. Keating (D-MA) (4 Co-sponsors, 3 Ds, 1 R). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for certain Ukrainian nationals.
- H.R.4048 Venezuelan Adjustment Act. Rep. Soto (D-FL) (4 Co-sponsors, 2 Ds, 2 Rs). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for certain Venezuelan nationals.
- H.R. 4319. Farm Workforce Modernization Act. Rep. Lofgren (D-CA) (14 Co-sponsors, 10 Ds and 4 Rs). Legalization for farm workers.
- H.R. 4569. Veteran Service Recognition Act. Rep. Takano (D-CA) (47 Co-sponsors, 45 Ds, 2 Rs) Allows noncitizen servicemembers to apply for naturalization during basic training and deported veterans to obtain green cards.
- H.R. 4627. Afghan Adjustment Act. Rep. Miller-Meeks (R-IA) (45 Co-sponsors. 23 Dems and 22 Rs). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for the Afghans brought to the United States under Operation Allies Welcome and creates a path for others leaving Afghanistan.
- H.R.4694 Protect Patriot Parents Act. Rep. Carbajal (D-CA) (2 Co-sponsors, 1 D, 1 R). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for certain parents of servicemembers.
- H.R.4722 Protect Patriot Spouses Act. Rep. Soto (D-FL) (2 Co-sponsors, 1 D, 1 R). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for certain military spouses.
- H.R.6381 Veterans Visa and Protection Act of 2023. Rep. Grijalva (D-AZ) (17 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Creates a visa to allow previously removed veterans to return to the United States and creates a pathway to legal permanent resident status for certain veterans in removal proceedings.
- H.R.6480 Strengthening our Workforce Act of 2023. Rep. Vasquez (D-NM) (3 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Provides a pathway to legal permanent resident status for individuals in certain professions.

Legal Immigration:

- H.R. 560. Northern Marianas Population Stabilization Act. Del. Gregorio Kilili Camacho Sablan (D-MP-At Large) (3 Cosponsors, 2 Ds, 1 R). Provides Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Resident status to certain otherwise qualifying non-U.S. nationals.
- H.R. 1033. Virgin Islands Visa Waiver Act of 2023. Del. Stacey Plaskett (Del. D-VI-At Large). Establishes a visa waiver program for the Virgin Islands.
- H.R. 1420. To modify the requirement to remain outside of the United States for Commonwealth Only Transitional Workers, and for other purposes. Del. Gregorio Kilili Camacho Sablan (D-MP-At Large).
- H.R. 1787. Carnivals are Real Entertainment Act. Rep. Zoe Lofgren (7 Co-sponsors, 4 Ds, 3 Rs). Makes workers with a traveling carnival or circus eligible for P visas.
- H.R. 1832. Special Immigrant Visas for Afghan Fullbright Scholars Act of 2023. Rep. John Garamendi (D-CA) (15 Co-sponsors, 14 Ds, 1 R). Amends the Afghan Allies Protection Act to provide special immigrant visas to certain Fullbright Scholars.
- H.R. 2823. Filipino Veterans Family Reunification Act of 2023. Rep. Ed Case (D-HI) (20 Cosponsors, 19 Ds, 1 R). Exempts children of certain Filipino World War II veterans from the numerical limitations on immigrant visas.
- H.R. 3274 Ensuring Security for Military Spouses Act. Rep. Strickland (D-WA) (1 R Co-Sponsor) Streamlines naturalization timeline for spouses of active duty servicemembers.
- H.R. 3442. Protecting Children of Long-Term Visa Holders. Rep. Ross (D-NC) (33 Co-sponsors 17 Rs and 16 Ds). Bill to protect and allow "Documented Dreamers" a path to adjust status.
- H.R. 3544 Remote Naturalization Act Rep. Torres (D-CA) (8 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to allow for remote naturalization ceremonies.
- H.R. 3808 Afghan Allies Protection Act of 2023. Rep. Crow (D-CO) (17 Co-sponsors, 13 Ds, 4 Rs). Authorizes additional special immigrant visas for Afghan allies and makes additional improvements to the program.
- H.R. 5155 Temporary Family Visitation Act. Rep. Peters (D-CA) (16 Co-sponsors, 12 D, 4 R). Bill to create a family visitor visa.
- H.R. 5560 Reuniting Families Act. Rep. Chu (D-CA) (40 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Reforms the family-sponsored immigration system.
- H.R. 5982 GRATEFUL Act. Rep. Kamlanger-Dove (D-CA) (1 R Co-sponsor). Makes otherwise unused visas available to foreign national US embassy employees. Incorporated into NDAA and became Public Law No 118-31.

High Skilled Immigration:

- H.R. 2827. Partner with Korea Act. Rep. Gerald Connolly (D-VA) (25 Co-sponsors, 20 Ds, 5 Rs). Establishes a high-skilled visa category for nationals of the Republic of Korea.
- H.R. 3735 Expanding Health Care Providers for Veterans Act. Rep. Tlaib (D-MI) (1 D Cosponsor). Makes all employees of the VA exempt from the H-1B numerical cap.
- H.R. 3986 ICELAND Act. Rep. Pingree (D-ME) (5 Co-sponsors, 2 Ds, 3 Rs). Creates an E non-immigrant employment visa for Icelandic nationals.
- H.R. 4358 PHDs First Act. Rep. Thanedar (D-MI) (1 R Co-sponsor). Provides a streamlined path to permanent residence to certain Ph.D. holders and allows dual intent for Ph.D. F-1 students.
- H.R. 4647 High-skilled Immigration Reform for Employment Act. Rep Krishnamoorthi (D-IL) (1 D Co-sponsor). Increases H-1B cap and exemptions and makes additional complementary changes.
- H.R. 4942. Conrad 30 and Physician Access Reauthorization Act. Rep. Schneider (D-IL) (78 Cosponsors, 62 Ds, 16 Rs). Reforms the Conrad 30 and Physician National Interest Waiver programs, which place foreign-born doctors in rural and medically underserved areas and give them a path to a green card. This bill makes the Conrad program permanent and expands and improves both programs.
- H.R. 5477 Keep STEM Talent Act of 2023. Rep. Foster (D-IL) (6 Co-sponsors, 5 D, 1 R). Provides a streamlined path to permanent residence to certain advanced STEM degree holders.
- H.R. 6205 Healthcare Workforce Resilience Act. Rep. Schneider (D-IL) (35 Co-sponsors, 31 Ds, 4 Rs). Recaptures unused immigrant visas for physicians and nurses.

Humanitarian:

- H.R. 1325. Asylum Seeker Work Authorization Act. Rep. Pingree (D-ME) (24 Co-sponsors, 23 D, 1 R). Provides employment authorization to asylum seekers.
- H.R. 1381. American Dream Employment Act of 2023. Rep. Pete Aguilar (D-CA) (3 Cosponsors, all Ds). Allows beneficiaries of DACA, DED, and TPS to serve as officers or employees of Congress.
- H.R. 2913 Lebanon TPS Act of 2023. Rep. Tlaib (D-MI) (2 Co-sponsors, both Ds). Designates Lebanon for Temporary Protected Status.
- H.R. 2946 Safe Zones Act of 2023. Rep. Gonzalez (D-TX). Revises credible fear standard and creates "safe zones" in Mexico and Guatemala for individuals to utilize seek protection within the United States without traveling to the border.
- H.R. 3259 RIDE for Ukraine Act. Rep. Quigley (D-IL) (9 Co-sponsors, 6 Ds, 3 Rs). Makes Ukrainian parolees eligible for REAL IDs.

- H.R. 3934 Uyghur Human Rights Protection Act. Rep. Wexton (D-VA) (17 Co-sponsors, 14 Ds, 3 Rs). Creates a Priority-2 refugee category for Uyghurs.
- H.R. 4156 Lady Liberty Act of 2023 Rep. Connolly (D-VA) (25 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Sets a floor for the number of refugees that must be allowed into the United States each fiscal year.
- H.R. 4285. Protecting Vulnerable Immigrant Youth Act. Rep. Gomez (D-CA) (36 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Makes Special Immigrant Juveniles an uncapped category, allowing them to get green cards immediately.
- H.R. 4309 ASPIRE Act. Rep. Torres (D-NY) (2 Co-sponsors, both Ds). Provides expedited access to employment authorization to asylum seekers.

Detention & Enforcement:

- H.R. 2374. New Way Forward Act. Rep. Garcia (D-IL) (32 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Reforms interior enforcement within the United States.
- H.R. 2760. Dignity for Detained Immigrants Act. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) (120 co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill on detention reform.
- H.R. 3050 Fair Adjudications for Immigrants Act. Rep. Espaillat (D-NY) (21 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Amends the definition of "conviction" in the Immigration and Nationality Act.
- H.R. 4954 Immigrants' Mental Health Act of 2023. Rep. Napolitano (C-CA) (10 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to improve access to mental healthcare for immigrants detained by CBP as well as CBP officers and to provide mental health training to CBP officers.
- H.R. 5166. Protecting Sensitive Locations Act. Rep. Espaillat (D-NY) (13 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to prohibit immigration enforcement in certain "sensitive locations."
- H.R. 5605 Humanitarian Standards for Individuals in Customs and Border Protection Custody Act. Rep. Ruiz (D-CA). Bill to require CPB to perform an initial health screening on detainees and provides minimum standards for CBP detention facilities.
- H.R. 6282 Humane Accountability Act. Rep. Vasquez (D-NM) (8 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill requiring a report on assault, abuse, sexual assault, and deaths occurring in DHS and ORR facilities as well as providing a summary of complaints filed about those facilities.

Protection & Integration

- H.R. 63. GRACE Act. Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX). Establishes family separation as an exceptional and extremely unusual hardship for cancellation of removal.
- H.R. 1571. Compact Impact Fairness Act of 2023. Rep. Ed Case (D-HI) (6 Co-sponsors, 3 Ds and 3 Rs). Allows citizens of the Freely Associated States lawfully residing in the U.S. to access certain federal public benefits.
- H.R. 1643. New Deal for New Americans. Rep. Meng (D-NY) (31 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Legislation to establish an office of New Americans and fund real immigrant integration.

- H.R. 1828. POWER Act. Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA) (24 Co-sponsors, all Ds). Protects certain victims of crime or serious labor violations from removal.
- H.R. 4170. Lifting Immigrant Families Through Benefits Access Restoration (LIFT the BAR) Act. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA). (103 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to eliminate the five-year bar on access to benefits for lawfully present immigrants.
- H.R. 5008. Health Equity and Access under the Law (HEAL) for Immigrant Families Act. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) (73 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to eliminate barriers to health care for immigrants.
- H.R.5025 National Office of New Americans Act. Rep. Meng (D-NY) (33 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to create an office within the Executive Office of the President to welcome and integrate immigrants and refugees in the United States.
- H.R. 5145. WISE Act. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) (37 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to protect victims of violence.
- H.R. 5248. Southeast Asian Deportation Relief Act. Rep. Chu (D-CA) (15 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to end deportations of Southeast Asian American refugees.
- H.R. 5471 Honor Our Commitment Act of 2023. Rep. Correa (D-CA) (1 R Co-sponsor) Bill to end deportations of certain Vietnamese nationals.
- H.R. 5797 Protecting Immigrants From Legal Exploitation Act of 2023. Rep. Foster (D-IL) (20 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to provide punishments for immigration-related fraud and provide relief to victims of fraud.

Cout Reform/Legal Counsel Bills

- H.R. 666. Access to Counsel Act. Rep. Jayapal (D-WA) (62 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Bill to ensure access to counsel for those in CBP custody.
- H.R. 2697. Fairness to Freedom Act of 2023. Rep. Torres (D-CA) (33 Co-sponsors, all Democrats). Appointed counsel bill.
- H.R. 6145 Immigration Court Efficiency and Children's Court Act of 2023. Rep. Goldman (D-NY) (3 Co-sponsors, 1 D, 2 Rs). Establishes a Children's Court to exclusively handle immigration cases of unaccompanied children.
