H.R. 2766 (Fallon), THE “SPECIAL DISTRICT FAIRNESS AND ACCESSIBILITY ACT”

A bill to require the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to issue guidance to agencies requiring special districts to be recognized as local government for the purpose of Federal financial assistance determinations.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) making a minor technical edit. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 2766, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 32-8 (Vote #1).

H.R. 6916 (Self), THE “FEDERAL PROGRAM INTEGRITY AND FRAUD PREVENTION ACT OF 2025”

A bill to amend title 41, United States Code, to identify individuals who commit certain Federal felonies implicating Federal programs as an excluded source on the System for Award Management Exclusions list, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to amend title 31, chapter 33 instead of title 41, chapter 47 (due to the revised bill’s applicability beyond federal contracting to all types of federal awards) and adds an explicit prohibition on the awarding of Federal contracts or grants or providing Federal financial assistance to an individual convicted of a covered felony arising out of any Federal contract, grant, cooperative agreement, loan or other financial assistance. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 6916, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 38-2, (Vote #2).

H.R. 428 (Fleischmann), THE “BONUSES FOR COST-CUTTERS ACT OF 2025”

A bill to amend title 5, United States Code, to enhance the authority under which Federal agencies may pay cash awards to employees for making cost saving disclosures, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to expand the cash award program to allow for compensation related to identification and prevention of improper payments that would result in financial loss for the government. It also strikes the requirement for the identified waste to be proposed for rescissions, shortens the initial and subsequent timeframes for GAO review, directs OMB to issue guidance for implementing the Act, and sets an effective date that is one year after enactment. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 428, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #3).

H.R. 1722 (Miller-Meeks), THE “BILLION DOLLAR BOONDOGGLE ACT OF 2025”

A bill to require an annual report of taxpayer-funded projects that are over budget and behind schedule.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) making a minor technical edit. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 1722, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 39-0, (Vote #4).

H.R. 4642 (Cline), THE “FISCAL CONTINGENCY PREPAREDNESS ACT”

A bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury, in coordination with the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, to examine the ability of the Federal Government to respond to potential fiscal shocks, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) making a minor technical edit. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 4642, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 39-1, (Vote #5).

A bill to amend the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 to ensure that other transaction agreements are reported to USAspending.gov, and for other purposes.

H.R. 7934 (Palmer), THE “SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT INFORMATION DATABASE ACT OF 2026”

A bill to amend chapter 3 of title 5, United States Code, to require the publication of settlement agreements, and for other purposes.

H.R. 5525 (Perry), THE “STOP DC CAPITAL AUTHORITARIAN MOTORVEHICLE ENFORCEMENT AND RESTORATION OF AUTONOMY “CAMERA” ACT”

A bill to repeal the authority of the District of Columbia to use automated traffic enforcement systems and to erect signage prohibiting right turns at a red traffic signal.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to change sections referencing D.C. code and repeal an additional provision related to an expansion plan for automated traffic enforcement systems. The amendment passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 5525, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 21-19, (Vote #8).

A bill to direct the United States Postal Service to designate a single, unique ZIP Code for Highland City, Utah.
