H.R. 8463 (Comer), THE “PRE-PAYMENT FRAUD PREVENTION AND TREASURY DATA ACCESS ACT”

A bill to establish governmentwide requirements for pre-payment fraud prevention actions, to provide the U.S. Treasury appropriate data resources, to facilitate participation in governmentwide anti-fraud data sharing, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) rewriting the Do Not Pay (DNP) system’s treatment under the Privacy Act (5 USC 552a) by requiring that data assets going into the system have a blanket System of Record Notice (SORN) established with a ‘Routine Use’ designation (similar to the process under OMB M-25-32) and establishing additional processes under the Privacy Act. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8463, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 35-1 (Vote #1).

H.R. 8464 (Comer), THE “STOPPING FRAUDULENT PAYMENTS ACT”

A bill to amend title 31, United States Code, to authorize pausing and segmenting payments, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to add a requirement on an agency to pause disbursement requests if they have reason to believe that the payment will lead to financial loss to the government for a State-administered program. The ANS text also makes technical edits to clarify the U.S. Treasury's obligations and requirements. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8464, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 23-17, (Vote #2).

H.R. 8312 (Sessions), THE "FRAUD PREVENTION AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT"

A bill to establish fraud prevention and program integrity functions and data sharing authorities within the Department of Treasury and a permanent governmentwide Inspector General for Fraud, Accountability, and Recovery, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to clarify that U.S. Treasury may only provide data sharing and analysis services under Sec. 2 of the bill to State and local governments responsible for the administration of federal funds on a voluntary basis in accordance with all applicable privacy and security laws and makes other technicals edits throughout. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8312, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 23-17, (Vote #3).

H.R. 8428 (Grothman), THE "FEDERAL FRAUD PREVENTION WORKFORCE TRAINING ACT"

A bill to amend title 5, United States Code, to establish a mandatory antifraud and improper payment training program for Federal program administrators, to provide for the availability of such training to State and local entities administering Federally funded programs, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) clarifying that the

training program made available to employees or contractors of a State shall be done so at no cost. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8428, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #4).

H.R. 8467 (Palmer), THE “ZEROING OUT MONETARY BENEFITS IMPROPERLY EXPENDED (ZOMBIE) ACT”

A bill to reform the Payment Integrity Information Act of 2019 to ensure executive agencies focus on fraud prevention, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) making minor technical edits. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8467, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #5).

H.R. 8466 (Biggs), THE “TAXPAYER RESOURCES USED IN EMERGENCIES (TRUE) ACCOUNTABILITY ACT”

A bill to require certain agencies to develop plans for internal control in the event of an emergency or crisis, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) making minor technical edits. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.
2. Mr. Walkinshaw offered an amendment to the ANS to require agencies to conduct after-action reviews within 180 days of obligating emergency funds, and to require the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to incorporate the findings of those reviews into reports to Congress. The amendment passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8466, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #6).

H.R. 8340 (Min), THE “TAXPAYER FUNDS OVERSIGHT AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT”

A bill to modify the governmentwide financial management plan, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to ensure that the governmentwide 4-year financial management plan includes strategies for enabling data sharing and joint fraud prevention initiatives with State and local governments that administer federal funded programs and to require that the plan be developed in consultation with various Chief Councils and the GAO. The amendment in the nature of a substitute passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8340, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #7).

H.R. 1755 (Timmons), THE “TIMELY AND ACCURATE BENEFITS ACT”

A bill to require an income verification platform for certain Federal benefit funds, and for other purposes.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to remove the requirement for States to use an Enhanced Income Verification Platform and replace it with a requirement for Treasury to make the Do Not Pay system available to States and local governments administering federally funded programs and requires such governments to make plans to properly determine recipient eligibility and conduct verification checks. The amendment passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 1755, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 40-0, (Vote #8).

H.R. 8107 (Khanna), THE “GOVERNMENT AUDIT AND ACCOUNTABILITY OF FEDERALLY FUNDED STATE-ADMINISTERED PROGRAMS ACT”

A bill to require the establishment of a list identifying program areas and administrative practices presenting the greatest risk to the integrity of Federal funds administered by States and local governments.

1. Mr. Comer offered an amendment in the nature of a substitute (ANS) to incorporate feedback provided by the Government Accountability Office (GAO) and other stakeholders. The amendment passed by voice vote.

The bill, H.R. 8107, as amended, was ordered favorably reported by Roll Call vote of 41-0, (Vote #9).
