

## Prof. Louis S. Rulli

Professor Rulli is a practice professor of law at the University of Pennsylvania Law School where his research and writing have focused on access to justice, civil asset forfeiture, and legal ethics. From 2008 until 2018, he served as the Law School's Director of Clinical Programs. He currently directs Penn Law's Civil Practice Clinic and Legislative Clinic and supervises law students certified by state and federal courts to represent indigent clients in civil matters. In addition to his faculty responsibilities, he serves as the Hearing Officer for the Board of Ethics of the City of Philadelphia and is a delegate to the House of Delegates of the Pennsylvania Bar Association and Access to Justice Advisor to the Philadelphia Bar Association.

Prior to joining the Penn Law faculty in 1995, Professor Rulli was the executive director of Community Legal Services in Philadelphia. He is a founding member of Pennsylvania's Lawyer Trust Account Board (IOLTA) and a past chairperson of the Philadelphia Bar Association's Commission on Judicial Selection and Retention. In 2019 he received the American Association of Law School's Father Robert Drinan Award and in 2015 he received the Praxis Award in Professional Ethics from Villanova University. He is a past recipient of Penn Law's Beacon Award for exemplary faculty commitment to pro bono service and the University of Pennsylvania's Provost Award for Distinguished Teaching.
