Re: Hearing titled "Fueling Unaffordability: How the Biden Administration's Policies Catalyzed Global Energy Scarcity and Compounded Inflation"

On Wednesday March 29, 2023, at 2:00 PM ET in 2154 Rayburn House Office Building, the Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Energy Policy, and Regulatory Affairs will host a hearing titled "Fueling Unaffordability: How the Biden Administration's Policies Catalyzed Global Energy Scarcity and Compounded Inflation."

I. BACKGROUND:

Americans face skyrocketing prices for energy essentials. Over the past two years, inflation has reached 40-year highs—raising prices of energy. Americans with low and fixed incomes are disproportionately impacted by energy price volatility.
