Re: Hearing titled “Driving Bad Policy: Examining EPA’s Tailpipe Emissions Rules and the Realities of a Rapid Electric Vehicle Transition”

On **Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at 2:00 PM ET, in room 2154 Rayburn House Office Building**, the Subcommittee on Economic Growth, Energy Policy, and Regulatory Affairs will host a hearing titled “Driving Bad Policy: Examining EPA’s Tailpipe Emissions Rules and the Realities of a Rapid Electric Vehicle Transition.”

I. BACKGROUND:

On April 12, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced a pair of tailpipe emissions rules which, if enacted, would impose strict mandates on vehicle makers’ total fleet emissions. EPA estimates the rules could force 67 percent of auto sales to be electric vehicles by 2032.

II. HEARING PURPOSE:

This hearing will examine the EPA’s proposed emissions standards for light-, medium-, and heavy-duty vehicles and the challenges of a rapid electric vehicle transition, including costs to consumers and manufacturers, added grid strain, and availability of critical minerals and raw materials, as well as other matters raised by the proposed standards
