Patrice Onwuka (On-wuka) is the Director of the Center for Economic Opportunity at the Independent Women's Forum, the leading national women's organization dedicated to developing and advancing policies that enhance people's freedom, opportunities, and well-being. Onwuka regularly testifies before Congress and state legislatures on fiscal and labor policy.
