As Chairman of the Massachusetts Historical Commission, he has overseen the award of over \$400 million in historic tax credits which has spawn construction throughout Massachusetts.

Galvin is a graduate of Boston College and holds a Juris Doctor from Suffolk University School of Law. He has been an active participant in the National Association of Secretaries of State, currently serving as co-Chairman of the Committee on Securities and former Co-Chair of the Committee on Presidential Primaries.
