Bernice Romero is currently the Senior Director of International Humanitarian Public Policy and Advocacy at Save the Children, responsible for leading Save the Children's US policy and advocacy around humanitarian crises and emergency response. She is also on the management team of Save the Children's Humanitarian Advocacy Working Group which oversees Save the Children's humanitarian advocacy and campaigning efforts worldwide. Bernice came to Save the Children after several years as the Advocacy and Campaigns Director for Oxfam International, where she oversaw Oxfam's international campaigns on humanitarian crises, trade, aid, climate change, food security, health and education. She also managed Oxfam's international advocacy offices in Washington, Geneva, Brussels and New York, targeting the International Finance Institutions, United Nations, European Union and World Trade Organization. Prior to that, Bernice was the Advocacy and Policy Deputy Director at Oxfam America.

Bernice earned her Masters' degree in Latin American studies from Stanford University, and her Bachelors' degree Magna Cum Laude in Hispanic Studies from Harvard College. Before coming to Washington she worked as an aide to Nobelaureate President Oscar Arias of Costa Rica and worked with him to establish the Centre for Peace and Reconciliation at the Arias Foundation in Costa Rica. Bernice also worked at the Latin America Program of the Woodrow Wilson Center where she focused on ethnic conflict, democratization and gender studies.
