<u>Building and over Webex</u>, the Committee on Oversight and Reform Subcommittee on National Security and the Committee on Armed Services Subcommittee on Cyber, Innovative Technologies, and Information Systems will hold a hybrid hearing with members of the National Security Commission on Artificial Intelligence (NSCAI), which released its final report on March 1, 2021.¹
