

Alyssa Hundrup, Director, Health Care – U.S. Government Accountability Office

Alyssa Hundrup is a Director on the Health Care team, at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) where she leads studies in several areas, including military health care, veterans' health care, and public health issues. Recent work has included reviews on the COVID-19 pandemic, including examining racial and ethnic disparities and the federal government's efforts to develop and distribute vaccines, as well as work related to GAO's high risk area on national efforts to prevent, respond to, and recover from drug misuse. Previously, Ms. Hundrup served as an Assistant Director on the Natural Resources and Environment team. There she led audits on a diverse body of work in the federal lands and water resources area, encompassing marine, coastal management, fisheries, wildlife, and endangered and invasive species issues. Ms. Hundrup earned a master's degree in public administration from Syracuse University and a bachelor's degree in natural resources ecology and conservation biology with a minor in Spanish from the University of Idaho. She also studied at the Universidad Nacional in Heredia, Costa Rica, under a J. William Fulbright Fellowship.
