In addition to the officers named above, we would also like to acknowledge the officers whose lives were lost to suicide. Their service, sacrifice, and the circumstances leading to their deaths are no less significant. In 2023, there were 7 suicides reported (2 active duty officers; 5 retired/separated officers).

Statewide Trends

South Carolina's violent crime rate decreased by 5.8% from 2022 to 2023.

This decrease is the third consecutive yearly decrease.

South Carolina's murder rate decreased by 5.9% from 2022 to 2023.

The overall number of murders decreased by 4.3%.

South Carolina's sexual battery rate decreased by 8.8% from 2022 to 2023.

Sexual battery in S.C. is at its lowest rate in comparison to the last 30 years.

South Carolina's robbery rate decreased by 3.3% from 2022 to 2023.

The robbery rate continues its 7-year decline, achieving the lowest rate in the last 30 years.

South Carolina's aggravated assault rate decreased by 5.7% from 2022 to 2023.

2023 saw a 5-year trend increase of 2.5% from 2019 to 2023 for aggravated assaults.

South Carolina's property crime decreased by 6.1% from 2022 to 2023.

This decrease is the twelfth consecutive yearly decrease.

South Carolina's B&E rate decreased by 9.6% from 2022 to 2023.

This decrease is the twelfth straight yearly decrease.

South Carolina's motor vehicle theft rate slightly increased by 0.3% from 2022 to 2023.

2023 saw a 5-year trend decrease of 10.8% from 2019 to 2023 for motor vehicle thefts.

South Carolina's larceny rate decreased by 6.5% from 2022 to 2023.

This decrease in SC's larceny rate continues the downward trend seen over the last twelve years.

South Carolina's arson rate increased by 1.9% from 2022 to 2023.

A 10-year trend shows a 9.6% decrease in arson rate from 2014 to 2023.

Weapon Law Violations increased by 1.8% from 2022 to 2023.

2023 marks ten straight years of increases in the rate of weapon law violations. 90.8% of weapon law violations included firearms (at least 75.1% were identified as handguns).

The rate of drug law violations decreased by 3.2% from 2022 to 2023.

The most common drug type in 2023 was marijuana (50.9), followed by stimulants (19.0%).

The number of assaults by intimate partners decreased by 0.5% from 2022 to 2023.

The number of law enforcement officers physically assaulted increased by 17.5% from 2022 to 2023.

Responding to a Disturbance was the most frequent officer activity reported for LEOKA victims of aggravated assault, simple assault, and intimidation.

Zero law enforcement officers were murdered in the line of duty in 2023. Eleven were reported in the last ten years.

From 2014 to 2023, the most common type of law enforcement action preceding the murder of an officer was responding to a disturbance and investigating suspicious person(s).








Intimate Partner Assaults




