



4 indicted in Charleston-area sex trafficking case; Search on for more victims



A federal grand jury handed down four indictments Tuesday in connection with a sex trafficking investigation, the U.S. Attorney's Office says.

CHARLESTON, S.C. (WCSC) - A federal grand jury handed down four indictments Tuesday in connection with a sex trafficking investigation, the U.S. Attorney's Office says.



commerce to promote an unlawful activity; false statements; conspiracy to commit money laundering; and money laundering.

- Calvin Wolfe, 54, of Charleston, for conspiracy to commit sex trafficking and sex trafficking by force, fraud, or coercion.
- Rose Stoner a/k/a Rose Wolfe, 50, of Charleston, for conspiracy to commit sex trafficking and sex trafficking by force, fraud, or coercion.
- Alexis McInnis, 20, of Charleston, for use of a facility of interstate commerce to promote an unlawful activity; false statements; and conspiracy to commit money laundering.

The 15-count indictment followed an investigation by Homeland Security Investigations and the Charleston Police Department.

The indictment alleges that between 2016 and 2025, Dais, and at times his co-conspirators, Wolfe and Stoner, recruited, enticed, harbored, transported, and trafficked at least five victims by force, fraud, or coercion, including one underage victim, a release from the agency states.

The indictment also alleges Dais and McInnis used facilities of interstate commerce to promote prostitution, and that they each made false statements to law enforcement during the investigation.

Sex trafficking carries a maximum penalty of life in prison and money laundering carries a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison.

Dais, Wolfe, and Stoner are currently detained pending trial, and a judge granted McInnis a \$5,000 unsecured bond on July 7.

Authorities with Homeland Security Investigations and the Charleston Police Department are seeking information that may help identify additional victims exploited by the accused.
