Ms. Lontz joined the Federal Air Marshal Service in 1993, and has led the Office of Law Enforcement's Office of Security Services and Assessments Division since July 2013. She manages nine diverse sections within SSA, including the Sensitive Security Information Program.

Ms. Lontz was a Special Agent with the Federal Aviation Administration for ten years. She conducted investigations and comprehensive airport and air carrier security assessments domestically and internationally. In June 2003, Ms. Lontz continued her career with the Federal Air Marshal Service as a Supervisory Federal Air Marshal (SFAM) in the Seattle Field Office responsible for supervising the operations, administration and training staffs. From January to September 2008, she was the Seattle Assistant Supervisory Air Marshal in Charge (ASAC). As the Supervisory Air Marshal in Charge (SAC) of the Seattle Field Office from 2008 to 2013, she led routine and emergent missions assigned to her office, with regional responsibilities covering Alaska, Washington, Oregon and Idaho. Ms. Lontz conducted frequent liaison with local and federal law enforcement, airport officials, and air carriers.
