Brad Huther was confirmed by the United States Senate on September 17, 2014 as the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). He is responsible for overseeing all financial management activities relating to HUD's programs and operations.

Brad has held leadership positions in highly diverse organizations. During the 1980's and 1990's, he was a CFO and a Chief Operating Officer for two major agencies within the Department of Commerce. Over the next decade, he was a Special Attaché at the World Intellectual Property Organization in Geneva, Switzerland; a senior director at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce; and President and Chief Executive Officer of the International Intellectual Property Institute, which is a non-profit economic development and a think tank; and a Distinguished Adjunct Professor in

Residence at American University where he taught graduate courses in Public Policy, Public Administration and Organizational Transformation.

Brad is a former Congressional Fellow and has been a Fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration since being elected in 1996. He chaired the Academy's Standing Panel on Executive Organization and Management, and was Vice-Chair of the Standing Panel on The Public Service. He received a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from the University of Miami and a Master of Public Administration degree from American University.
