Question for Ms. Harris

1. GSA said that their milestones for Enterprise Infrastructure Solutions (EIS) implementation are different from what GAO used in their report. Why did GAO use milestones that are not in line with what GSA is trying to achieve?

In our report,¹ we used the milestones that are published on GSA's EIS transition timeline website.² This website states that the timeline is as of March 5, 2019 and also states that GSA last reviewed the information on the website on April 1, 2020. GSA did not make us aware of any other implementation milestones that it is using for the EIS transition.

In addition, we provided GSA an opportunity to review a draft of our report before it was issued. GSA responded in February 2020 that it did not have any comments on the report. Given that our reported information about the milestones matches what is currently on GSA's website, and the agency did not indicate to us any differences when it reviewed our draft report, we had no basis to use different milestones.
