Paul Steidler is a senior fellow of the Lexington Institute who researches, studies, and discusses logistics and technology issues. Since 2017, he has addressed financial and operational policies pertaining to the U.S. Postal Service (USPS).

Steidler's work on USPS has appeared in news outlets like *The Washington Post*, *National Public Radio*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *Bloomberg*, *Financial Times*, *Boston Globe*, *Miami Herald*, *Los Angeles Times*, and *The Hill*. He strongly warned against enacting the 2022 Postal Service Reform Act and USPS's plans to lengthen mail delivery times starting October 1, 2021.

Mr. Steidler also serves on the U.S. Department of State's Advisory Committee on International Postal and Delivery Services. He has strongly advocated for U.S. policymakers to pursue policies at the Universal Postal Union (UPU) so that Americans do not subsidize foreign mail and packages. The UPU is comprised of the postal services of more than 190 nations.

In addition to generating issue briefs, Op-Eds, and other analyses, Mr. Steidler has led the Lexington Institute's work to host several conferences about the U.S. Postal Service on Capitol Hill. Speakers have come from widely divergent viewpoints, including labor leaders and senior U.S. Postal Service officials.

Mr. Steidler is a magna cum laude graduate from Villanova University with a B.A. in Political Science and Honors. He resides in Reston, Virginia.
