Re: Hearing titled "Bid Protest Reform: Understanding the Problem"

On Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. ET in room HVC-210 of the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center, the Subcommittee on Government Operations will host a hearing titled "Bid Protest Reform: Identifying the Problem."
