Frank N. Albergo serves as the National President of the Postal Police Officers Association (PPOA), a role he has held since his election in 2020 and reaffirmed by re-election in 2023. A dedicated and outspoken advocate for Postal Police Officers and the security of the U.S. Mail, Albergo has been instrumental in bringing national attention to the surge in mail theft and attacks on postal employees.

In addition to his leadership at PPOA, Albergo represents law enforcement officers more broadly as an Area Vice President for the National Association of Police Organizations (NAPO) and as the Postal Police Agency President for the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association (FLEOA).

His advocacy has garnered national media coverage in outlets including *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Washington Post*, *Time Magazine*, *Fox & Friends*, *Inside Edition*, and numerous local television stations. On September 7, 2022, Albergo testified before Congress during a House field hearing titled “Delivering for Pennsylvania: Examining Postal Service Delivery and Operations from the Cradle of Liberty.”

Albergo began his postal career as a letter carrier shortly after graduating from college. In 2000, he entered the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) to become a uniformed Postal Police Officer. He later served as the PPOA’s Brooklyn Regional Representative and was elected National 1st Vice President in 2014. During his second term as Vice President, Albergo was appointed to serve as an arbitrator on the 2020 Postal Service Interest Arbitration panel (PPOA v. USPS).
