Preston Brashers is the senior policy analyst for tax policy in The Heritage Foundation's Grover M. Hermann Center for the Federal Budget. Brashers has researched, published, and provided analysis on tax and budget issues, public policy, and economics. Brashers joined the Hermann Center in October 2021.

Brashers was a contributor to Department of Treasury chapter in 2025 Mandate for Leadership: The Conservative Promise. He also contributed to the analysis for the Heritage Foundation's Budget Blueprint for Fiscal Year 2023 and the Budget Blueprint for Fiscal Year 2022. He has published reports related to the Inflation Reduction Act, the state and local tax deduction, IRS foreign tax credit rules, accountability of the executive and legislative branches and gas tax policy proposals. He has spoken before diverse audiences, teaching and providing commentary on tax, budget, and economic issues. He has also submitted federal regulatory comments.

Prior to coming to The Heritage Foundation, Brashers was a tax policy specialist 4 in the Research and Fiscal Analysis division of the Washington state Department of Revenue (DOR) and a transfer pricing manager at PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC). While at the Washington DOR, Brashers provided research and modeling support to Washington's Tax Structure Work Group. He modeled the budget impact of various major tax proposals that were being considered in the state. While at PwC, he worked on a wide range of projects, assisting multinational companies with documentation, compliance, audit, and planning issues.

Brashers received his Ph.D. and M.S. in Economics from the University of Kentucky and his B.S. in Economics from the University of Washington. As a graduate student, he was a research assistant at the University of Kentucky's Center for Poverty Research, and he taught courses on business statistics, macroeconomics, and microeconomics.
