Re: Hearing titled "America's Report Card: Oversight of K-12 Public Education"

On Tuesday, January 30, at 2:00 PM ET, in room 2154 of the Rayburn House Office Building, the Oversight and Accountability Subcommittee on Health Care and Financial Services will host a hearing titled "America's Report Card: Oversight of K-12 Public Education."

I. BACKGROUND:

Public schools are struggling to perform their most basic task: educating America's children. Since the COVID-19 pandemic, student performance across the nation has suffered. The Nation's Report Card assessment shows that test scores in reading and math have significantly declined, especially for lower-performing students. Additionally, chronic absenteeism is a hindrance to efforts by teachers to help students catch up.

II. HEARING PURPOSE:

This hearing will examine the long-lasting impacts of pandemic-era school closures, current issues in K-12 education, and strategies for state and local school districts to help students get back on track.
