Patrice Onwuka (On-wuka) is the Director of the Center for Economic Opportunity at the Independent Women's Forum, the leading national women's organization dedicated to developing and advancing policies that enhance people's freedom, opportunities, and well-being. She researches and produces scholarship on a variety of labor, tax, economic, and tech issues.

Onwuka regularly testifies before Congress and state legislatures, works directly with congressional and state leaders, and briefs federal agency heads on fiscal and labor policy.

Patrice is a Tony Blankley Fellow at The Steamboat Institute and also an adjunct senior fellow with The Philanthropy Roundtable. She co-hosts the popular and influential morning talk radio program, O'Connor & Company, every Friday on WMAL, serving the DC, MD, and VA region and beyond.

Onwuka is a prolific writer and media commentator. She hosts the "New Agenda for Black Women" column on Newsmax.com and is a contributor to the *Washington Examiner* and *The Hill*. Her op-eds have appeared in the *Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *Barron's*, *CNBC*, *Bloomberg*, and other national outlets. She is a frequent guest on cable news networks, including *Fox News* and *Newsmax TV*, and podcasts such as *The Sean Spicer Show*.
