

Ann Bollin is serving her fourth term in the Michigan House of Representatives and is Chair of the House Appropriations Committee. Before joining the Legislature, she spent 16 years as the Brighton Township Clerk, where she administered numerous local, state, and federal elections and became widely recognized for her hands-on expertise in election operations, voter services, and compliance with state and federal law.

Her leadership in election administration includes service on the Michigan Association of Municipal Clerks Legislative Committee and the Council of Election Officials, where she worked directly on policy, training, and best practices for clerks across the state. She has also served on the boards of the Michigan Townships Association and the Greater Brighton Area Chamber of Commerce, and remains active in her church and on the Livingston County Catholic Charities Board of Directors.

Ann studied at Central Michigan University and later became a Taubman Fellow at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. She also served on the boards of the National Conference of State Legislatures and the Council of State Governments.

Throughout her legislative career, she has focused on strengthening transparency, accountability, and responsible fiscal stewardship, while continuing to draw on her deep background in election administration and local government.
