

Biography

Chuck Gray was elected Wyoming's 24th Secretary of State in 2022. As Secretary of State, he oversees the administration of statewide elections, registration of all statutorily authorized business entities, registration of trade names and trademarks, regulation of Wyoming's securities industry, and enforcement of Wyoming's securities statutes. He also serves on the State Loan and Investment Board, the Board of Land Commissioners, and the State Building Commission. As Wyoming Secretary of State, he is also the Lieutenant Governor of Wyoming.

Prior to his tenure as Secretary of State, Secretary Gray served in the Wyoming House of Representatives for three terms, representing House District 57 in Natrona County. In his first session as a member of the Wyoming House of Representatives, he was the lead sponsor of the ultrasound bill, the first pro-life bill passed in 30 years. He was also the lead sponsor of Wyoming's voter ID law, which was signed into law in 2021. During his time in the legislature, he served on numerous committees, including Minerals, Business & Economic Development; Agriculture, State and Public Lands; Revenue; Judiciary; and Management Audit.

Secretary Gray is known for his conservative record. He is a six-time CPAC award winner, winning the award for his conservative voting record each year in the legislature. He has also received Wyoming Right to Life's Platinum Award for his pro-life record.

Secretary Gray graduated from the Wharton School of Business in 2012 with a B.S. in economics.
