

Debo P. Adegbile is a partner in WilmerHale's Government and Regulatory Litigation group and Chair of the firm's Anti-discrimination practice. His work focuses on matters at the intersection of law, business, government enforcement and policy. He has significant experience in commercial, government-facing, appellate and United States Supreme Court litigation, as well as in complex investigations and strategic counseling in high-stakes matters. His clients include corporations, trade associations, municipalities and agencies, colleges and universities and other not-for-profit institutions. Debo twice defended the constitutionality of two core provisions of the Voting Rights Act in oral arguments before the United States Supreme Court, in *Northwest Austin Municipal Utility District v. Holder* and *Shelby County v. Holder*. Debo has litigated voting rights and redistricting cases for more than two decades. Debo was also part of the WilmerHale team that successfully defended Harvard University's admissions policies against a federal challenge in the U.S. Court for the District of Massachusetts in *SFFA v. Harvard University*, and is now pending on appeal. In 2020 Debo was court appointed as amicus curiae to brief and argue an en banc Fair Housing Act appeal presenting an issue of first impression in the Second Circuit Court of Appeals.

Debo has testified before various congressional committees on multiple occasions. He currently serves as a commissioner on the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, appointed by President Obama in 2016. Previously, he served as Senior Counsel to Patrick Leahy, then-Chairman of the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee, and as the Acting President and Director of Litigation for the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. He is the Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees and a graduate of Connecticut College; a graduate and trustee of NYU School of Law, and also serves as the Vice Chair on the Board of Directors of the Vera Institute of Justice.
