Biography of Lisa L. Dixon

Lisa Dixon serves as the Executive Director of Lawyers Democracy Fund, a nonpartisan organization with a long history of advancing the role of ethics, integrity, and legal professionalism in the electoral process, including safeguarding the right of eligible voters to vote. LDF primarily conducts, funds, and publishes research and analysis regarding the effectiveness of current and proposed election methods, particularly on voter confidence.

Under Ms. Dixon's leadership, LDF periodically engages in public-interest litigation where appropriate to uphold the rule of law and integrity in elections. LDF also submits briefs as amicus curiae in important elections cases to provide a pro-integrity perspective. Notable examples include defending voter identification requirements in *Crawford v. Marion County*, 553 U.S. 181 (2008), and supporting a state's ability to defend its duly enacted laws in *Berger v. North Carolina State Conference of the NAACP*, 142 S.Ct. 2191 (2022).

Ms. Dixon is also a consultant for the Republican National Lawyers Association, serving as their Legal Counsel. Previously, Ms. Dixon practiced at Holtzman Vogel, where she specialized in tax-exempt organizations, campaign finance and election law, and lobbying compliance.

During law school, she interned for the Office of Chief Counsel, Procedure and Administration, at the Internal Revenue Service and at the Center for Law and Religious Freedom. Before law school, she served as the Assistant Student Division Director at The Federalist Society for Law and Public Policy Studies and interned at The Heritage Foundation's Center for Legal and Judicial Studies.

Ms. Dixon earned a J.D. from the University of Virginia School of Law in 2010, an M.A. in History from the University of Virginia in 2010, and a B.A. in History from Hillsdale College in 2005. After 18 years on the East Coast, mostly in northern Virginia, she recently returned to her native Michigan, where she lives with her husband and three sons.
