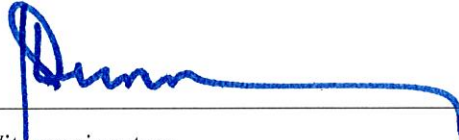
(B) In the case of a witness appearing in a non-governmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include— (i) a curriculum vitae; (ii) a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts, grants, or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the past 36 months by the witness or by an entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (iii) a disclosure of whether the witness is a fiduciary (including, but not limited to, a director, officer, advisor, or resident agent) of any organization or entity that has an interest in the subject matter of the hearing.

(C) The disclosure referred to in subdivision (B)(ii) shall include— (i) the amount and source of each Federal grant (or subgrant thereof) or contract (or subcontract thereof) related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (ii) the amount and country of origin of any payment or contract related to the subject matter of the hearing originating with a foreign government.

(D) Such statements, with appropriate redactions to protect the privacy or security of the witness, shall be made publicly available in electronic form 24 hours before the witness appears to the extent practicable, but not later than one day after the witness appears.

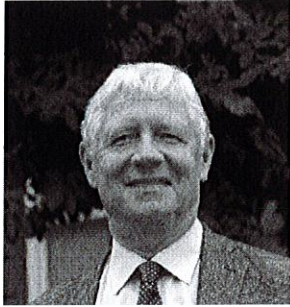

SHORT BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE



Joseph DUNNE

is the Director of the **European Parliament Liaison Office in Washington (EPLO)**, tasked with fostering and deepening relations between the European Parliament and the US Congress.

Previously, in 2018/2019, he was a Senior Resident Fellow at the German Marshall Fund of the United States, and a Visiting Fellow at the Schar School of Policy and Government in George Mason University.

Joseph worked as a Director in the Directorate General for European Parliamentary Research Services (EPRS) from 2016 to 2018, responsible for the European Parliament Library. Prior to that, he was Acting Director for Impact Assessment and European Added Value, helping to set up an impact assessment and evaluation capacity in the Parliament and developing new scrutiny tools in the area of Better Regulation.

His earlier career spanned work in the legislative committees, notably seven years as Head of Secretariat (Staff Director) for the Committee on Internal Market and Consumer Protection. Joseph was Deputy Chef de Cabinet (Deputy Chief of Staff) for the European Parliament President (Speaker) Pat Cox from 2002 to 2004.

Before working in the Parliament, Joseph spent nine years in the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs, which included a period as Secretary of the Embassy in Madrid (1982 - 1986).

He edited the first edition of '*Mapping the Cost of Non-Europe*' in April 2014 and has a B. Moderatorship from Trinity College Dublin and an MA in EU Law from King's College London.
